Wooten Wisdom...



It seems that lately different media venues have been focusing on the theme of fear. Two of the most popular have been Disney's movie "Frozen" and the book soon to turn movie Divergent by Veronica Roth. Perhaps so many media outlets are exploring the topic of fear because it is such a powerful emotion. So much in this world has us fearful: Will I have enough money to retire comfortably? Will I find a job I like? Will I be able to raise responsible, loving and generous children? Will I be safe on the road, on the internet, in my house? Will the people and communities I care about thrive?

Usually our body responds to fear in one of two ways: fight or flight. As fear overtakes us, adrenaline kicks in and triggers us to respond to that fear in one of two ways. We either run and hide in an effort to ignore or get away from our fear, or we face it head on and fight it but not always in a wise way.

"Divergent" and "Frozen" each explore a different reaction to fear. In Divergent, the main character Tris chooses to fight through her fear. Brought up in a family that honored selflessness above all else, Tris leaves that life when she is given the choice at 16 years old. She chooses to live in a group of people who honor bravery. Yet, as she learns what real bravery is, she discovers that often self-sacrifice and bravery are the same thing. It is truly brave to stick yourself out for another, to open yourself up instead of "pull up the drawbridge" or "circle the wagons."

On the other hand, in Disney's "Frozen" Elsa lives in fear of her power to create snow and ice. In reaction, she locks herself away from her sister and the world because she is afraid of hurting someone. She lets fear control her life and would rather "go it alone" instead of put others at risk. But with the encouragement and example of her sister Anna's act of selfless love, Elsa was able to realize that love was the answer to her fears. She could control her power with love, while fear made her power uncontrollable and destructive.

The idea that true bravery is about self-sacrifice and selfless love, resonates with the picture of love we have in scripture. In the most complete act of self-sacrifice and selfless love, Jesus dies on the cross. Yet, in that act, he was not destroyed as reason would have us expect. Instead, through that vulnerable act, new life is able to spring forth.

So, in a world which can cause so much fear in our lives, how do we react? Do we hide from it or ignore it? Do we use force to drive it away? Or are we willing to open ourselves up, be vulnerable in those places of fear in order to move into something new?

*At a Special Called Meeting on February 2nd,
Session...*

...welcomed all officers including the Board of Trustees to express thanks for those completing terms, and to discuss our work as leaders committed to the responsibility of our respective offices as we orient, prepare, and examine newly elected officers prior to their installation.

...reviewed and discussed a document, "Presbyterian Polity Top Ten List," a tutorial in Presbyterian values and our roles and responsibilities. We also discussed and updated our **Church Leadership and Covenant Agreement: Our Promises to God, Our Promises to Each Other, and Our Promises to Our Congregation.**

...looked to the future and changes we as a church need to consider, by watching a video, "An Alternate Way," by Walter Brueggemann, an Old Testament scholar. We discussed ideas for how we can witness our faith and act it out in an alternative way in our current society and culture.

...approved the ordination of Sherman Gittens as Ruling Elder; the installation Sherman Gittens and Carrie Horton as Ruling Elders; the ordination of Lori Oliver as Deacon; and the installation of Lori Oliver, Barb Boerschlein, and Sue Edwards as Deacons to take place at a Service of Ordination and Installation on February 2, 2014 during worship.

...appointed Darla Diehl to conduct the annual Financial Review for the year ending 2013.

...approved the minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation, January 26, 2014.

...heard a report from Pastor Brandi that approximately 100 attended the Presbytery meeting we hosted on January 28, 2014. Feedback was positive with many commenting on how hospitable we are. She expressed thanks to Elder Wasmer for being the point-person working with Presbytery for organizing the event. She also expressed thanks to all who worked to make it happen -- Deacons, Session members, Trustees, Music Minister, and other members who volunteered their time.

... payment of our per capita assessment to Presbytery: our per capita assessment is based on our total active membership. We ask our members to pay their own per capita and in recent years we have been paying only what has been collected. Presbytery in its accounting keeps track of each church's per capita past due. Our annual per capita for 2014 is \$4245. In order to meet our 2014 per capita assessment, Session by motion (Elder Wasmer), approved using money received from our members designated for their per capita and transferring money from the Budget Line Item, "Presbytery Mission" to fulfill our 2014 per capita obligation. Meanwhile, Session will investigate the amount in per capita that is past due from previous years and determine a payment plan.

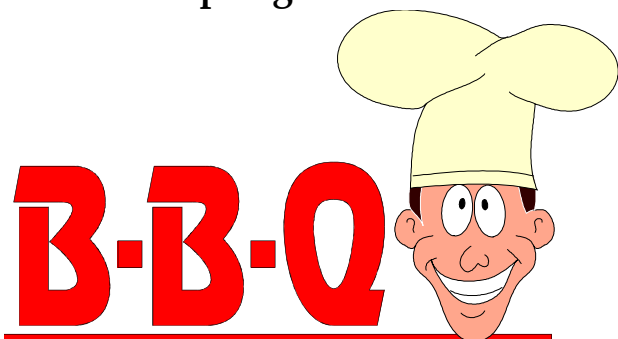

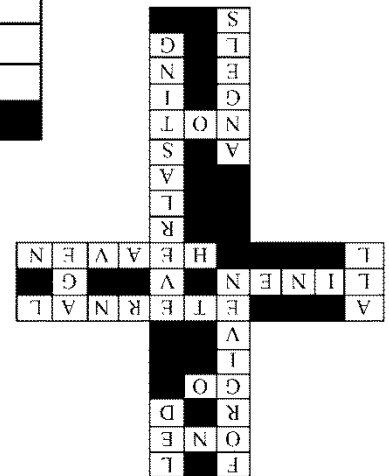
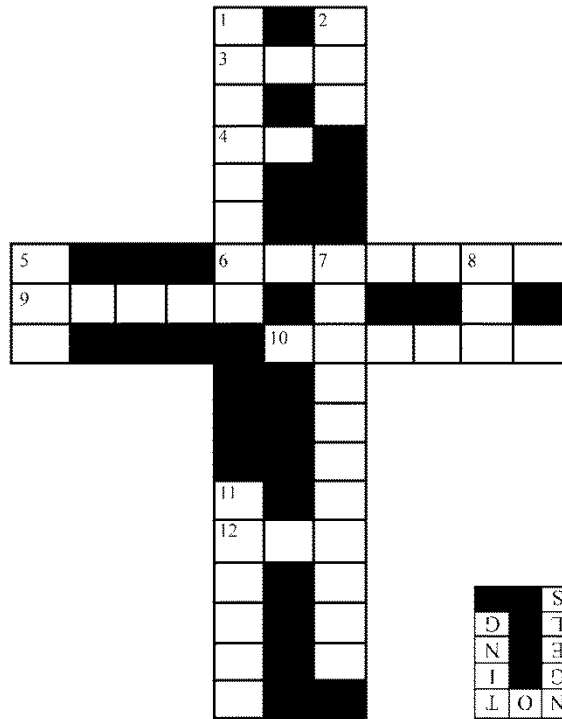

...What's on my mind...
Steadfastness --
in times of rapid change!

I love the biblical concept of steadfast love -- covenant faithfulness.

The term is used to describe God's faithfulness to the people chosen as God's covenant people. The term encompasses love, loyalty, and mutual expectations -- the love that will not let us go, and our love that will not let God go -- no matter what!

We had a great "Engage" Weekend last month with Ray Jones from GA, talking about the love of God which is so wonderful that it must be shared. The good news of God's steadfast love is *too good* to keep to ourselves. We thought about new ways of "hanging out" in our communities to begin to build new relationships and deepen existing ones. I was delighted that 26 of our congregations had folks present at the event -- it is a good start.

The truth is that, though God's love for us is steadfast, the ways in which God communicates this love, and calls us to share the love we know in Jesus Christ, change. There, I said the word -- *change*. God's steadfastness is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. And God's world keeps changing. God expects us to communicate the good news in ways that can be understood in the culture(s) in which we are living.

To be steadfast is not to keep telling the good news as if nothing is changing. To be steadfast is to commit ourselves to build relationships through which the love of God in Jesus Christ is communicated in *real time*.

Where in your community and with whom is God calling you to *hang out* this month? How will you be *steadfast* in this changing world?
