Wandering in the woods of Black Creek Park, I was trying to get my daughter Mira to notice details in nature. I thought it would be fun for us to be “nature explorers” examining and discovering the world around us. Well, Mira didn’t like this idea as much as I did.

As I tried to point out moss, a spider’s web, the feel and look of different tree bark, she only wanted to run ahead down the path. She didn’t want to stop and observe the details, and my desire to do so only frustratingly held her back. At one point, she ran back to me, grabbed my hand and said “Come on mommy, let’s go faster.”

SESSION MEETING SUMMARY

At its September 16th meeting, Session...

...welcomed Clif Genge, a candidate for ministry who will be doing an internship (a requirement for candidacy) with us through June 2015.

...reviewed income and expense documents with Finance Chair, Dave Abell.

...began discussing the 2015 budget and items we need to consider including budget requests from the Music Director and the Youth Director, Pastor Terms of Call, and changes in Major Medical fees for the Pastor. Dave will meet again with Session in November.

...received the Treasurer's Report for the months ending July 31, 2014 and August 31, 2014.

...heard a report from Pastor Brandi on 22 pastoral contacts including visits, phone conversations, e-mail, hospital visits, etc.

...noted that the church website is finished and that Pastor Brandi, Candy and Geoff Wasmer will receive training on September 25th on maintaining/ updating the site.

...noted that Sister Barbara Moore will preach on October 26, 2014 when Brandi is out of town.

...changed the date of the October Session meeting to Tuesday, October 14, 2014.

...noted that Clif Genge will preach on October 19, 2014.

...noted that Susan Orr will be a guest preacher on November 23, 2014.

...heard a report from Pastor Brandi that each month Presbytery's Resource and Education Commission holds a church in prayer. Chili First is in prayer this month and we have asked the Commission to pray for us as we begin to live in to our new Mission Statement.

...noted that Pastor Brandi will begin meetings with Rev. Susan Hartley, Scottsville Presbyterian to explore the facets of unicameral leadership.

...noted that Pastor Brandi will schedule meetings with Caledonia First's Pastor Nancy Reinert to explore ways in which we can collaborate.

...heard a report from Pastor Brandi that she received an inquiry from The Father's House to see if our church (on occasion) could be used for funeral services. Session discussed this possibility and implications for fees, logistics, management, etc. Considering that this might be an opportunity for accommodating needs of Chili families as well as others, we agreed that this would be one way of living in to our Mission for "Caring for the Community." We will ask the Board of Trustees to consider this and defer to their decision.

...noted that as part of Pastor Brandi's Kick-Off Sunday worship service, she shared the three callings from our new Mission Statement, "Rooted in Faith," "Growing Together," and "Care for the Community." During that service, we each took a ribbon to symbolize an area that resonated with us. Pastor Brandi also shared that we would be having future conversations about how we can live in to our Mission. Thus, Session is scheduling three conversations in which we can all engage and exchange ideas. These conversations will be held after worship on October 12, October 26, and November 9, 2014. We will also ask our youth groups to share their ideas. All members are invited to participate in all three conversations.

...reviewed correspondence sent (formal response to the draft report of the Triennial Visit) and correspondence received (a revised draft report of the Triennial visit). Session agreed to pursue continued dialogue with the Committee on Ministry regarding the Triennial Visit Report.

...placed activity dates on the Master Calendar:

October 12, 2014 *Conversation on "Rooted in Faith" as our Mission*

October 26, 2014 *Conversation on "Growing Together" as our Mission*

November 9, 2014 *Conversation on "Care for the Community" as our Mission*

...heard a report from Elder McCauley on Harvest Team plans for the Wine Social, the Family Fun Fair, and an after school event at Cameron Community Center.

...heard a report from Elder McCauley on having our church listed in *Suburban News* in the listing of area churches. Session noted that the *Suburban News* is the one local paper that reaches residents in Gates, Chili, Churchville, etc. Our church can be listed for a cost of ~\$10.00 per week. Or, if we purchase advertising of at least \$500 per year, the church listing is free. Session will take this under advisement.

...planned for the Annual Joint Meeting with Session and Deacons scheduled for October 6, 2014 at 6:30 p.m. ...heard a report from Elder Gittens that the theme for Stewardship is "Abundant Joy and Overflowing Generosity." Plans are underway for a presentation and communication with the congregation. ...heard a report from Elder McCauley that the Nominating Committee has been meeting since July and is continuing to work to fill positions.

Mission

- ❖ **PEACE & GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING/World Wide Communion** will kick-off on Sunday, October 5th.
- ❖ **CENTER FOR YOUTH SERVICES** provides for the needs of homeless children. We will be collecting clothing items for children of all ages and will deliver them at the end of November. Your generous donations will be greatly appreciated. The following items are needed: boy's crew socks and boxer shorts; girl's cotton underwear and sports bras; and gently used or new hoodies.
- ❖ **CAMERON COMMUNITY MINISTRIES.** Our second mission project is an opportunity to volunteer your time at Cameron Community Ministries. There is a need for adults to assist with their after-school tutoring program and to help serve a meal to the children. Tutors would be assisting staff (so no planning or prior knowledge would be needed). The meal is prepared by Food Link and volunteers would be distributing the food. Our New Mission Statement: Recently, our church has updated our Mission Statement, and now that I have had some time to reflect on it I would like to share my thoughts.

“Recognizing that Jesus is the true vine and we are the branches, we are called to be rooted in faith, grow together, and care for the community.” We are “branches,” only a part of a larger vine, which represents God. I have always liked this idea and it holds multiple meanings which are so fitting to our life in faith. It first helps me to realize that as Christians, we are not on an island, and even though we have a responsibility to provide fruit to the vine, we are not the only branch providing fruit. God calls all of us to produce fruit in many different ways that fit who we are and what God has gifted us to do.

Because we are all different “branches” on a vine, it also means that we should be working together to strengthen the vine. In reminiscing about the previous Triennium Conference I attended (where the theme centered on John 15) I remember each speaker urgently asking youth to work together to lift each other up, to carry each other, and to walk together to strengthen God’s kingdom. It was so inspiring to see 5000 youth yearning to come together as a body of believers to live out this calling that continuously went out from different speakers at the conference.

Unfortunately, there are many times when we become complaining Christians, especially when we don’t always have things our way. And then there are Christians who argue with other Christians about varying views to the point where tempers flare and feelings start to get hurt. Are we always being good “branches” in the vine and working together? Unfortunately, the answer in many churches is “no” - far too many times.

In 1 Corinthians 14:26 it states that, “when we come together, each of us has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation. Everything must be done so that the church may be built up.” We all have a story through our continuous growing in faith, and we need to use our story to build up the church, not to destroy it.

What’s interesting here is that the end of our Mission Statement calls for this! Our call as “branches” on the vine is to be Rooted in Faith, Grow Together, and to Care for our Community. We are challenged to grow together as a church. When someone in our church is hurting, we are called to reach out and walk with them, help them back up when they fall, and to share in their sufferings. Lives are forever changed when your hand meets God’s hand to support our church family when there is a need.

So I hope you will take some time to investigate the Mission Statement on your own. It sets an example of what we hope to be as a church, but it can challenge you personally to new ways of thinking in your faith as well. If you spend some time finding yourself through the Mission Statement, you may end up being surprised at what God is showing you.

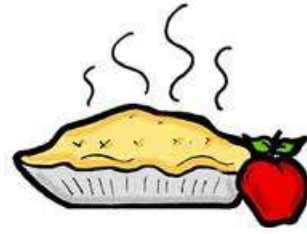
