Installed as Deacons were Sharon Breeze, Fred Mollon, Becky Sosik



At its meeting on January 9, 2023, Session...

...held a devotion discussion based on Psalm 84: 1-5 which speaks to the joy of dwelling with God. We shared a favorite dwelling place: the woods, a rocking chair, viewing the lake, my craft room, a friend's house, bird watching, quiet moments by myself in my own house.

- ... VOTED to approve the agenda with items added
- ... VOTED to approve the Consent Agenda
- ... VOTED to receive the Treasurer's report and summary for the month ending December 31, 2022
- ... VOTED to be a partner church with the New Worshiping Community, "Pray and Play" organized by Pastor Whitney Scoville. "Pray and Play" is a group of people who meet together to worship, study the word of God, pray together, and play together. It is an all-inclusive local worshipping environment that focuses on meeting and serving the unique needs of little ones and their parents in our community. "Pray and Play" is a New Worshiping Community here. It is non-denominational. It came about from the 1001 New Worshiping Communities (NWC) PC/USA initiative to bring people in the community together to access resources and develop a network of relationships to help do God's work in the world. There are three New Worshiping Communities within our Presbytery.

Whitney will further acquaint our congregation with more details about this new initiative. ...heard a report from Clerk Nancy Huffman that that she attended two Presbytery workshops for Clerks of Session. One (12/13/2022) was a review of changes in the 2023 Terms of Call and Covenant Agreement forms. The other (1/5/2023) was in regard to changes in the Annual Statistical report

...placed activity dates on the Master Calendar

-February 9, 2023 7:00 PM- Beginning date of six-week book study, "Acts: Catching Up with the Spirit"

...heard a report from the Personnel Committee that they are discussing a proposed position description, Director of Youth and Families.

...heard a report from the Personnel Committee regarding a Music Accompanist and VOTED to employ Mary Risewick on a contractual basis to serve as Music Accompanist for 2 ½ months, and, VOTED to pay Mary Risewick \$75.00 per Wednesday Choir practice and \$100.00 per Sunday Service through the end of March.

... VOTED to receive the report of the Nominating Committee

...VOTED to confirm the Members of the Mission Fund Policy Committee as follows:

Session Member: Barbara Wasmer Trustee Member: Andy Atwater

One Congregation Member: Roger Willis

One Youth Director: Adam Scoville

Youth Delegate: Unfilled because currently no youth are eligible

Leadership News (continued)

...VOTED to approve the Sabbatical Temporary Supply Job Description and Covenant Agreement for Non-Installed Pastors, Whitney Scoville and Fred Mollon, that will be submitted to the Committee on Ministry for approval.

...noted that Pastor Brandi and Clerk Huffman are reviewing Session's Annual Calendar of Action Items to determine what might be completed prior to our sabbatical so that Session might enjoy a sabbatical renewal. They will report in February. Other Boards are encouraged to explore how they might alter responsibilities during the sabbatical.

... VOTED to appoint Darla Diehl to conduct the Annual Financial Review for 2022. Session expressed appreciation for Darla's willingness to share her talent in this way.

... heard a report from Clerk, Nancy Huffman regarding changes made by General Assembly for the reporting of church statistics for 2022. They include changes to the financial section, reporting youth in the congregation (rather than Christian Education numbers), adding a 17 & Under category for reporting Age Distribution of Active Members, adding a non-binary/genderqueer category for reporting Gender Distribution, and removing definitions from the Racial/Ethnic category. Further, now that we have livestreaming, the reporting of estimated Average Weekly Worship Attendance is of interest. We are encouraged by Presbytery to report number of attendees each week for livestream worship. We typically use the Attendance book in the Narthex to compute average weekly attendance. Geoff Wasmer provided "raw data" analysis of live stream views ranging from 30 seconds through the end of the stream as well as the actual live stream and after the conclusion of the livestream. From our own experience and knowledge, we estimate that 10 people consistently watch the full service weekly. We will continue to monitor (most likely with Presbytery's help) the collection of average weekly attendance via Facebook livestream.

- ...VOTED to discontinue uploading our worship service to YouTube.
- ...VOTED to receive the Annual Statistical Report for 2022 with financial information forthcoming
- ...noted that the Annual Report booklet will be available this week
- ...noted that Session will hold a breakfast workshop on Sunday, January 29th at 8:30 AM for the purpose of orientation and training of newly elected officers as required by the PC/USA Book of Order.

Retiring, current and newly elected officers as well as Trustees are invited to attend this workshop. The installation and ordination of newly elected officers and recognition of Trustees will take place during worship on Sunday, January 29, 2023

... VOTED to ask the Investment Committee, Jerry Huffman, and Andy Atwater to explore options for investing Miller Trust funds.

...noted that our Session's Elder Commissioners to Presbytery serve on a rotating basis. Elder Nancy Huffman volunteered to attend the Presbytery Meeting on January 28, 2023.

... VOTED to adjourn at 8:25 PM
