There are a few great moments I have experienced that are life changing. From my wedding to the birth of my children, I have seen God's blessings beyond measure. And recently, one of those moments happened to me that has surely been life changing.

Student loan forgiveness. Sounds silly, but I feel like I've won the lottery and I need to share the full story.

I went to college and received a bachelors in music education, and a masters in music therapy. I compiled hefty loans to complete my degrees. I worked in both settings for several years, until I was called into ministry.

My student loan debt was surreal. The number was so big, and I just figured I would take it to my grave when I die. It was embarrassing. It was discouraging. The interest piled up as the years went by. I kept thinking back and wondering how did this happen? I was 18 years old when I signed the paperwork to begin college. I had no idea what I was signing. I had the basic idea of finances but I was never trained how to do finances in the real world. I made many mistakes. I had to have my parents bail me out many times.

I thought that this would always be a part of my life story. But God had a different plan. In 2022, the Public Service Loan Forgiveness program (PSLF), a program designed to forgive loans of people working in public service, changed some of the criteria to allow church staff members to qualify (previously churches were not included in the program). Whitney begged me to apply, but I didn't think I met the criteria, and I had an excuse not to fill out the form each step of the way. These loans controlled me to the point that I had no hope and they dictated my life.

But I applied. It was hard, but easy. The process was tough to figure out. It took several mistakes to finally call and get the correct information. I remember filling out the form and dropping it in the mail and saying, "Well, God your will be done, but it's not going to happen. I'm not getting my hopes up."

It's those moments when you have lost all hope when God can step in and do miraculous things. Matthew 19:26 states that "With God, all things are possible." And Friday June 2, 2023, God proved it again in my life. Debt larger than a mortgage on a house is gone. It's GONE. The statement says \$0.00. It is a miracle. I've been given new life. I cannot praise God enough.

I still check the account. It doesn't feel real. I made those mistakes. I signed those loans into existence. And yet my debt has been paid. This is the same as receiving new life in Christ Jesus. We all sin. We all make mistakes. We all fall short. But when God sent Jesus into the world, the life He lived and His death on the cross was life changing. We would've never figured out how to break free from the bondage of sin. Jesus paid that price, and because of that, we are free.

My hope for all of you is to never to give up on God, no matter how bleak things may look. Keep praying and trusting that God will reveal His plan for your life and never lose hope. As Christians we are free! Shout it from the rooftop! Tell those around you.

I feel I have a new financial life. I plan to teach my children every detail of finances that I can before they start making big financial decisions in life. We need to do this as a society.

And the greater lesson in all of this is that God can do the impossible. Praise be to God.
