

So many opportunities for Renewal -- discovery, being in the present, being alert for something new -- occurred during our 4-month sabbatical. We engaged in many renewal opportunities on a personal level as well as through church family activities. 21 of our church family and friends visited the Memorial Art Gallery on May 21^{st.} Our catered Church Picnic on June 11th brought 66 of us to "just come and enjoy" worship, delicious food, fun and fellowship. 16 of us enjoyed learning about and interacting with alpacas at the Alpaca Yoga on July 14th. 25 of us went to the Red Wings game on July 22nd where "Christmas in July" was the featured theme. Following the game, we enjoyed fantastic fireworks coordinated with Christmas music! On July 23rd, following worship, 17 of us walked the Church's Labyrinth Path which is just down the street on Chili Avenue. The Labyrinth path, a "Caring for Our Community" Session initiative, was developed over the past two years by Tim Engelbrecht, the Boy Scouts, and several church family members. We signed the "Register" at the trail head and admired the benches which Tim and Marla made. The path is there to be enjoyed by the community. On August 5th, 7 of us participated in a Devotional Walk at Homesteads for Hope led by Pastor Whitney Scoville. Ashleigh Naugle, our official photographer has been taking photos throughout the season to document our activities in preparation for the Season of Reflection.

On a personal level, so many of us have been submitting our "Jesus in the Journey" photos to Sandy McCauley to be posted in the weekly "Chili Happenings" emails, worship bulletins, the projected announcements prior to worship, our newsletters, and our bulletin board. As a matter of fact, our bulletin board is covered with shared photos.

Your ongoing contributions to support the purchase of the "Spreader/Fertilizer" for Homesteads for Hope continue to be welcomed and appreciated through the conclusion of the Season of Renewal on September 4th. We have exceeded our goal of \$900 and donations received beyond the \$900 will be given to Homesteads for Hope. As of August 22, we have collected an additional \$109 for Homesteads for Hope.

Perhaps in renewal, you have discovered a renewed energy for serving as a church leader on one of our boards or standing committees. Yes, it's a new year and the Nominating Committee will begin its work this fall. We ask that you prayerfully consider service on one of our Boards or Committees. You would be elected at the Annual meeting in January 2024 and begin service at that time.

Here is a summary of positions the Nominating Committee will be filling.

For Session: 3 people for the Class of 2027- (Three-year term beginning in 2024). Of those in the current Class of 2024, Grace Engelbrecht is eligible to be nominated. See the Church Directory for listings of Officers and terms.

For Trustees: 3 people for Class of 2027 – (Three-year term beginning in 2024). Of those in the current Class of 2024, Brian Faatz, Jerry Huffman, and John Rowe are eligible to be nominated.

Deacons: 3 people for Class of 2027 – (Three-year term beginning in 2024). (Of those in the current Class of 2024, Judie McGaffick is eligible to be nominated. Barb Boerschlein and Sue Edwards are completing their second term and are not eligible to re-up.)

Endowment Committee for Class of 2029: (Five-year term) Congregational rep-does not have to be an Elder

Personnel Committee: Class of 2027 - (Two Year term) Congregational rep-does not have to be an Elder

Nominating Committee Class of 2025 – (one year term) nominees to represent Session, Trustees, Deacons, 2 congregational reps.

...VOTED to approve the Consent Agenda with the following items lifted and placed under New Business for Discussion:

Food Cupboard Grant Submission dated 7/14/23.

Clerk's Report re: Funeral/Memorial Service

...welcomed Andy Atwater, Chair of the Board of Trustees for the QUARTERLY REVIEW OF FINANCES. Andy reviewed the current Treasurer's report as well as the Profit and Loss Statements from April 30 – July 30, 2023. He noted that overall, we are in good shape at this point in the year.

...VOTED to receive the Treasurer's report and summary for the months ending April 30, May 31, June 30, and July 30, 2023.

...welcomed Jan Hoyt and Debbie Lamphron from the Food Cupboard Committee to discuss SUSTAINABILITY OF THE FOOD CUPBOARD MINISTRY. Deb reviewed the Food Cupboard finances and how the need has grown from the initial 3 families to 80 that they have served recently. The Food Cupboard has received grants, and should be able to be sustainable thru January of 2024, but they would like to be added as a line item in the upcoming budget. Amount to be determined.

... VOTED to approve adding the Food Cupboard to our 2024-2025 budget.

...had further discussion about how the Food Cupboard has grown and that more structure is needed. Let's get a unified effort in place. Preliminary discussion items to think about:

The Food Cupboard becoming its own committee. There should be a Session rep and possibly a Trustee and congregational.

Budget Lines to consider:

\$2700.00/yr.Administrator (15-20 hrs. per month)

\$3000.00 yearly for workshops, retreats for training of volunteers, and advertising outreach. Ideas discussed in the meeting included the following: shirts, workshops, recognition training, luncheon.

\$800 to \$1000/monthFood to stock cupboard

Reaching out to other community groups like scouts, veterans, etc.

Possibly get money from: St. Pauly box, Simple Supper, Fall Supper

...reviewed and discussed the Marilyn Lichtman Foundation Grant proposal submitted by the Food Cupboard Committee on July 14, 2023.

...VOTED to approve rewording Item #2 (Name of Organization to which grant would be paid) in the Marilyn Lichtman Foundation Grant application to read:

"First Presbyterian Church of Chili with Food Cupboard Ministry as the byline".
