

First, I want to say how grateful I am for the gift of our sabbatical time. I found it to be as restful and reenergizing as I had hoped. And, I hope that all of you enjoyed the different rhythm of this time as well

As you know, we are in the Season of Reflection. This special season is a reminder of the importance of taking the time to reflect on the sabbatical season we have just participated in. The gift of sabbatical time for all of us is a spiritual practice. It is an opportunity for renewal, for rest, for doing things a little differently, for paying closer attention to the Spirit's presence in and around us.

As with any spiritual practice or even any significant endeavor, it is important to reflect on the experience after the fact. Some important questions to ask ourselves about this sabbatical time are:

- What did I learn about myself?
- What did Hearn about God?
- * What did I learn from others?
- * What were the gifts I received?
- * What were the challenges?
- * What things am I being called to do differently in the future?

Now that the sabbatical is over, I have been praying with these questions. I have been reflecting on my experiences and discovering what I need to carry with me over the threshold into our post sabbatical time as well as what I need to leave behind.

On Sunday, October 15th, we will have our Visio Divina Celebration Service. This will be our time to share as a community, through pictures and reflecting together, our sabbatical experiences. I look forward to sharing with you what I learned, particularly what I discovered about how art and our spiritual life intersect. I also look forward to teaching the art journaling class on October 26th. I promise that you don't have to be an artist, or even consider yourself creative, to participate in the class. I hope you will consider signing up.

As the four months drew to a close, I looked forward to being among you once more. I continue to be deeply grateful for this church, the place where I am known and loved and cared for; the place where you are a part of my story and I am a part of yours. It is good to be among you once again as we


A TISKIT, A TASKET, A FOOD CUPBOARD BASKET?!



The Grocery Run

The Grocery Run is sponsored by the Third Presbyterian Church of Rochester to benefit area Food Cupboards. This year, our church will be participating in this run. There are a variety of runs and walks you can select from; however, our Food Cupboard's Team has chosen to sponsor the Virtual Run/Walk. When one signs up for the Virtual Run/Walk, he/she can choose any distance to run, bike, walk, stroll, and can complete this event <u>anytime</u>, <u>anywhere</u> between <u>November 3rd – 5th</u>. (Of course, you could still sign-up to participate in the runs and/or walks

being held in the City of Rochester for this event. These races are explained at http://www.groceryrun.org.) If you are not a runner or walker, you can choose to go to our team's website and donate any amount of money you feel comfortable in contributing to the Cupboard. The registration fee for our Virtual Run/Walk is \$30.00, and our Food Cupboard will get the entire \$30.00 back to help cover food expenses. Each month our Cupboard services between 70 to 80 households and feeds between 200 to 300 people. Even with the help of Foodlink pricing, we spend approximately \$1,000 each month on food.

Leadership News

At its Meeting on September 5, 2023 Session...

...Welcomed back Pastor Brandi. Today being her first day back after her sabbatical, she noted that we are now upon the threshold of Reflection. We each shared the gifts of our sabbatical as well as challenges we may have experienced during this time. We were particularly grateful for outside the church activities, the gift of having Pastor Whitney Scoville and Elder Fred Mollon as our pulpit supply and pastoral care, the opportunity to appreciate where we have been and look to the future, our own personal growth, the gift of being able to explore our personal interests through art appreciation, travel, and the gift of reaffirmation. We also shared some personal challenges that emerged and expressed gratitude for the support from our church family and the pastoral care available to us. Pastor Brandi opened the meeting with prayer.

- ...<u>VOTED</u> to approve the Agenda with items added.
- ...<u>VOTED</u> to approve the Consent Agenda.
- ...<u>VOTED</u> to receive the Treasurer's Report and summary for the month ending August 31, 2023.
- ...heard a report on how excited she is to be back in the office. She loves her job! She expressed gratitude for the sabbatical time away and for the opportunity that sabbaticals provide in order to reflect on where she is in God's plan. Through her experiences of renewal and reflection, Pastor Brandi affirmed that she loves being a pastor and all the responsibilities of pastorship and that she is so fortunate to have a supportive church family.
- ...noted that Presbytery has called a special meeting on September 19th. Elder Gernhardt volunteer to attend.

...placed activity dates on the Master Calendar:

October 15, 2023 - Visio Divina Celebration;

October 26, 2023 - Art Journaling Workshop

June 9, 2024 - Church Picnic at Union Station Park Lodge

- ...noted a suggestion to have an announcement be placed on our website about the Food Cupboard- distribution dates, call for volunteers and other general items.
- ...noted that signage has been placed in the Nursery noting that masks will be used upon request of parents, caregivers, grandparents, etc.
- ...established June 9, 2024 for the Church picnic at Union Station Park Lodge.
- ...noted that Pastor Brandi will work with the Stewardship Planning Committee to schedule a meeting at the end of September. Session had a brief discussion on alternative ways for Season Team Sign-up.
- ...made plans for the Annual Joint Meeting of Session and Deacons Monday, October 9, 2023 at 6:30.
- ...<u>VOTED</u> to use Memorial Fund monies for signage along the Labyrinth Path. At this time, Session did not indicate which Memorial Fund Option Designation to use.
- ...responded to narrative questions for the annual reading of Session minutes.

Leadership News continued....

- What is your church's Mission Statement? How has your congregation lived into its mission since the last review?
- -We lived into "Rooted in Faith" knowing that our sabbatical grant plan was based on our strong faith roots.
- -We lived into "Growing Together" by purposely planning for renewal during our sabbatical, and purposely planning for reflection at the conclusion of our sabbatical.
- -We lived into "Caring for the Community" by growing our Food Pantry ministry.

What is the greatest impact to your congregation from the pandemic?

-The use of technology to make our services available and accessible to those who do not or cannot attend worship in person.

One blessing from the past year for which your congregation is most grateful?

- -Being awarded a Lilly Grant to support our Pastor's and our Congregation's sabbatical.
- -Receiving grants, donations, and community volunteers to support our Food Pantry.
- ...reflected on the "Sustainability of the Food Cupboard" discussion of August 14, 2023 and agreed that there is a need for further conversation with the Food Cupboard Committee. Pastor Brandi will contact Sue Johnson, Chair of the Food Cupboard Committee to establish a date for the Committee and the Session to meet informally and share thoughts, questions, goals, vision for the future, as we move forward.
- ...agreed to research what "Amplify Media" is and what it can offer to our congregation and church family.
- ...discussed Simple Supper and noted that its original purpose was to bring young families and children together for fellowship, Bible Study, and conversation. Our young families at this time are gathering with the "Pray and Play" Worshipping Community with whom we are partnering. Knowing that Adam Scoville is now filling a new position, Director of Families and Youth, whose job description involves designing, preparing, and implementing programs for family and youth with a focus on connecting the church with the greater community Session agreed that Adam needed financial resources to do this. Upon motion and second, Session VOTED to allocate \$500 currently budgeted for Simple Supper (PE 10) to support programs developed by Adam Scoville, Director of Families and Youth.
- ...<u>VOTED</u> to change the name of the Simple Supper Designated Fund to "Families and Youth Ministries".
- ...reviewed a report from Adam Scoville, Minister of Music on his activities to date to find a piano accompanist as follows:
- -communicated with Roberts Wesleyan University and Eastman School of Music staff and student groups to advertise the position with no response
- -worked with Presbytery leaders to place an ad on the Presbytery website and E-news
- -advertised the position on our Chili Pres Website, however there is a cost of \$1 per day to keep it on the site
- -placed posting on the Church's Facebook page
- -explored placing an ad in Westside News at a cost of ~\$121.80 per month

Leadership News continued....

...<u>VOTED</u> to authorize the \$103.50 remaining in the Session Discretion budget (PE 19) and \$261.90 from the Designated Fund "Session Fund" to advertise the Piano Accompanist position for up to 3 months.

...VOTED to use \$100 from the Schwer Donation to the Church, which is now in the General Fund, to reimburse the Deacons for the cost of refreshments served at the Schwer Memorial Service reception.

...<u>VOTED</u> to correct and update the amount to be taken from the Miller Trust each month to support the salary of the new position, Director of Families and Youth to be a total of \$2294.55 (i.e., Salary differential: \$1825.88, and Benefits: \$468.67), not the previously approved \$2348.53 (8/14/2023).

...VOTED to appoint Elder Barbara Wasmer to serve as Clerk Pro-Tem for the Annual Joint Meeting of Session and Deacons, October 9, 2023 and the Stated Meeting of the Session, October 9, 2023.

...prior to our shared benediction based on the Great Commission, Pastor Brandi led us in a special prayer asking for love and support for Ginny Harkness and the family as we were just made aware that Joe Harkness, our dear friend, and member, is now in hospice and on his final journey to God.
