Wooten's Wonderings 🏼 🍹

There is a lot of chaos and hurt in our world right now, isn't there? Wars wage and innocent civilians get caught in the crosshairs. Natural disasters destroy homes, businesses, neighborhoods and lives. Violence is perpetrated against people groups as well as strangers. Anger, fear, loneliness, hunger, and failing health is all around us.

We are weary and it is ok to admit that. So, in the midst of our weariness, how can we, as people of faith, respond?

That is the question our Season Theme this year seeks to answer. The theme is **"How Does a Weary World Rejoice?"** This series was developed by *A Sanctified Art* and here is what they said about this year's Advent theme:

"Sara Speed, one of our founding creative partners, referenced a poem she had written a few years ago. In it, she lists many seemingly mundane actions that fill our days: like stretching your body awake, looking at the night sky, making room on the subway, helping a neighbor and so on. In the last stanza of the poem, she concludes:

How does a weary world rejoice? I would guess soul by soul and day by day. but if you ask me, I bet most of it counts.

In this poem is the answer- it all counts. We need to acknowledge the weariness of our world while also seeking real and daily moments of joy. We need to remember that all of life can be a prayer."

Each week we will respond to this question with a statement inspired by scripture. Each text helps us find rhythms for rejoicing even in the midst of difficult circumstances.

To aid us in seeking joy, there is a devotional booklet based on the theme and an Advent calendar for adults as well as a separate one for children and families. I hope you will pick these up and use them to guide you through this season of preparation.

As we move through the series, let us create space to acknowledge the weariness of the world while celebrating God's closeness with great joy.






December 24th Worship Services



An Aspiring Grinch

Christmas is coming! And as we have been preparing for the holidays, doing all the decorating and shopping, the television at the Scoville house has been showing round the clock Christmas movies. So that basically means that we have been watching the Grinch round the clock! (Truthfully, Grinch has been on since July...)

As the story goes in Dr. Seuss's classic Christmas tale, How the Grinch Stole Christmas, the Grinch suffers from having a small heart, in which he lacks the joy for Christmas. So he tries to put a stop to Christmas by taking anything and everything Christmas related away from the town of Whoville, but in the end, he comes to understand what Christmas is all about and his heart grows three sizes! This heart change makes a big difference in his life and he returns Christmas to everyone.

How many times have you been wronged and haven't been upset about it? That is Godly forgiveness. No pointing fingers. No holding grudges.

It is through the eyes of this simple Christmas movie that we can be inspired to be kind, forgiving others, and willing to admit our wrongdoings. We can set ourselves apart from the world around us by living out the true meaning of Christmas.

"Welcome Christmas - While we stand - Heart to heart - And hand in hand." During this holiday season, may you allow God to mold you into a new creation again. May you experience profound joy and spread it to those around you. It might just make all the difference in the world.
