Wooten's Wonderings 🛬

As 2023 comes to a close and 2024 begins, it is natural for us to reflect on the past year. We think about loved ones we have lost, trials that have tested us, and opportunities we wish we had taken. We recall the memories made on family vacations, the new births and additions to our family circle, and the unexpected joys that inspired us praise God.

When we look back, we often focus on our failures- those things that we wished we could have done differently and the habits that plague us no matter how hard we try to shake them off. While reflecting on the past year is healthy, I find that we have a tendency to get too focused and caught up in our failures. After all, our new year's resolutions are usually formed by things that we want to change: we want to be thinner, go to the gym more, be nicer, kinder, more considerate, more spiritual, etc. These are all based in a sense of failure. Last year, we didn't do these things sufficiently and we want to make amends in the New Year for these weaknesses.

The process of prayerfully reflecting on the past year can be beneficial if we do not stay there and center on our incompleteness. Looking back, we can learn from what we see, but then we must move forward. We must focus on the journey ahead and the grace of a new beginning. A new year is a fresh start. God graces us with the blessing of a new year, and the opportunity to embrace all that life has to offer. When we look at scripture, we find a God who constantly allows us to start again- a God who refreshes, renews and restores.

Here are some statements which have helped guide my process of prayerful reflection. May they be of benefit to you.

One note before you begin: as we write down our hopes for the coming year, we do so with humility. None of us really knows what the future will bring. So, remember that this is a starting point- these are your intentions. They are not set in stone.

Looking Toward 2024:

- * What are the "givens", the "non-negotiables"?
- * What I hope to bring from 2023 into the coming year- habits, priorities, interests, new skills/learnings?
- * What I hope not to bring?
- * What events already on the calendar?
- * What new events or experiences I want to make space for?
- * Is there a problem or issue I feel called to tend to (personal, societal, global)?
- * What would make me come alive this year?

Those attending who are on the "active membership roll" are eligible to vote and we need a quorum of 9 "Active Members". We look forward to "seeing" you all on Sunday, January 21st.

- ...<u>VOTED</u> to receive the Treasurer's Report and summary for the month ending November 30, 2023.
- ...noted that will be working from home the week after Christmas.
- ...noted that Pastor Brandi will be attending a Synod meeting January 8-11, 2024.
- ... rescheduled the January Stated Meeting to be Thursday, January 4, 2024 at 6:30 PM in the Dining Room.
- ...placed Activity Dates on the Master Calendar

- ...recognized Elena Castillo for bringing joy to the Bell Choir, volunteering for Childcare and enthusiastically participating in our Church family activities.
- ... <u>VOTED</u> to approve the Session's Annual Report for 2023.
- ...heard a report from Nancy Huffman, Chair of the Nominating Committee on the status of pool of persons eligible to serve on Committees and Boards. At this time most of our positions are filled and the Committee is grateful for those who have agreed to serve either by re-upping or responding to an opportunity to serve.
- ... reviewed a Preliminary Stewardship Campaign report submitted by Jerry Huffman.

He noted that in November a mailing was sent to 73 families and individuals. To date 49 pledges have been received totaling \$145,184 which represents an average increase of 5.5% over what these same people pledged in 2023. Not all pledges have been received as of this date. A final report will be forthcoming.

Session expressed its deep appreciation to the Stewardship Committee and to our church family for this successful campaign focusing on how we are changing lives.
