# Wooten's Wonderings 🛬



Peter has always been one of my favorite disciples. He is relatable. He is earnest. He wants to know more about who Jesus is and to dive deeper into a heart forward faith. Over time and through the lectionary cycles, we get glimpses here and there of Peter. But they are often told out of order and some parts of his story are not told as much as others. If you read a novel out of order, the story would not make much sense. Our Lent Team and I focused our bible study this year on the life of Peter. As we considered, in order, the different parts of his story, a new understanding about Peter and his wandering faith journey emerged. It renewed our enthusiasm for this relatable disciple.

And so, we decided to use Sanctified Art's new Lent theme "Wandering Heart: Figuring out faith with Peter." Peter is often "all in". Sometimes, he gets it right, sometimes he is way off base. He is not polished nor perfect, but he always seeks the heart of God. He has, as our theme suggests, a wandering heart. His journey of faith, like ours, has its ups and downs, its ins and outs. Sometimes we feel so close to God and at other times, we wander off in a different direction.

So, this Lent we are joining Peter in figuring out faith. As Sanctified Art describes this series, "we are hoping to wander alongside him, open to what we might learn about Jesus and ourselves by stepping in his shoes." So, let us take up the journey and wander with Peter as he seeks to know Jesus better.


Happy New Year! We 're excited to share with you the impact your clothing shed made over the last year....

# Leadership News ...continued

# At a Special Called Meeting of the Session for training and examination of newly elected officers Session...

...welcomed current Deacons, Trustees, Session members, newly elected officers, and those completing terms, to discuss our work as leaders committed to the responsibility of our respective offices as we orient, prepare, and examine newly elected officers prior to their installation.

...studied a passage titled "The Recklessness of Faith" from The Balancing Act: A Daily Rediscovery of Grace by Robert Schnase. The passage opened with a quote, "I love the recklessness of faith. First you leap and then you grow wings". The author noted how leaders often make or have to make decisions that are "radical, passionate, intentional, risk taking, and extravagant—and all are dangerously edgy". As Pastor Brandi facilitated our discussion, we shared how some or all of these adjectives applied to our Boards' work. We realized that when called to be a leader we may feel unqualified and saying "yes" to the call can be edgy. Pastor Brandi reminded us that "God does not call the qualified: God qualifies the called"!

We shared examples of how we leaders have made decisions that are "radical, passionate, intentional, risk taking, and extravagant" and how wonderfully powerful these decisions have been for our church's health and well-being. Some past and more recent examples that resonate with one or more of these practices are hosting a St. Pauly's box, creating a Seasonal Structure, installing an elevator, creating a Mission Fund Committee, supporting the "Pray and Pray" worshipping community, launching a Food Cupboard for the community, pursuing a Lilly grant to support our sabbatical, hosting a Food Link cooking demonstration, creating a Director of Families and Youth position, organizing and participating in Mission Trips, developing our Labyrinth Trail, and discerning use of the Miller Trust. Most importantly we recognized the passion and trust our Boards have in going about their ministry. The Deacons' passionate caregiving and support for our church family; our Trustees who faithfully oversee and monitor our financial health and work to care for and preserve our historic structure; and our Session who oversees program growth and development within our Presbyterian polity.

... VOTED to approve the Ordination of Lori Gittens as Deacon, the Installation of Lori Gittens, Judie McGaffick, and Lori Oliver as Deacon, and the Installation of Grace Engelbrecht as Ruling Elder to take place at a Service of Ordination and Installation on January 28, 2024 during worship.

...VOTED to adjourn the meeting at 9:30 AM.

As our closing prayer, we read aloud, "Disturb us Lord" a prayer attributed to Sir Frances Drake that challenges us to be "disturbed" to dare more boldly to venture more on wider seas.

# Thoughts from the Minister of Music



### DREAM BIG

We all have dreams. We all desire more for our lives. It doesn't matter what stage of life you might be in, I know so many people who strive for more in their lives.
