As we begin to make the transition into summer, I was thinking about all the things we might be looking forward to- trips to camps, vacation plans with family, relaxing in the pool or outside, summer reading lists. We are waiting with anticipation for these things that will happen but are not quite here yet. In addition to these, we might find ourselves waiting in a variety of waiting rooms- to board a plane, to see the doctor, for the car maintenance to be done, for our number to be called. Or maybe you are waiting in line, waiting in traffic, waiting for test results.

There are many moments in which we find ourselves "in-between" and often they can feel like wasted time. We would rather get through the road work delay, arrive at our vacation destination, or get the doctor's appointment over with. But what if we were able to turn these moments into an opportunity to connect with God?

Whether it is waiting in line, waiting to board a plane, or waiting for test results, the in-between

times can be a place to practice our faith. Rev. Dr. Hollie Holt-Woehl created this prayer practice and writes,

"I have noticed many of us get cranky or angry or impatient while waiting. I wanted to find a way to transform this waiting experience into an opportunity to pray. I decided to create a prayer guide that would be simple, and somewhat easy to remember, that could be put in a pocket or purse or saved on a mobile device that could be taken out while waiting. It is my hope to share this guide widely so that this current time of waiting may be transformed for everyone."

"Jesus this is [name], [name] this is Jesus."


## If still waiting pray...

#### At its scheduled meeting on June 3, 2024, Session...

...Heard report from Pastor Brandi. She had a total of 31 contacts with members. She reported that she will be taking three weeks of vacation from July 21 – August 8, returning to the pulpit on August 11. She will also take one week at the end of August/beginning of September.

...Because of Brandi being away, upon motion and second, Session voted to move September's communion service to the second Sunday, September 8, 2024.

...Heard a report from the Clerk. There were two items forwarded to the elders concerning the new guidelines from the Board of Pensions, and the requirements, as per the Book of Order, for policies which are gathered in our "Safe Church Policy."

...Heard a report from Tim Engelbrecht on the status of our tax exempt status with the Town of Chili concerning our Labyrinth trail; that he and Andy Atwater had made a presentation to the Town Assessment Board regarding this.

...Agreed to give special recognition to Roger Willis for his leadership re: the recent Rummage Sale, which raised funds for Habitat for Humanity.

...Did an annual review of Pastor Brandi, Sandy McCauley, and Adam Scoville


... Upon motion and second, adjourned with a shared devotional led by Pastor Brandi.

## It Makes a Difference!

This week, I went and walked our church's Labyrinth Trail to have some time to reflect and be in nature. For me, I find God in the midst of Creation; the sounds of birds, the wind flowing through the trees, seeing awesome wildlife, and the rush of a waterfall. I find peace and inspiration in being outside in God's artwork.

As I entered the trail, I began browsing through our trail registry. Most people just sign their names in the book, but there was an unnamed entry in the book that shared their experience. This is what was written:

"I happened to stumble upon this trail in a time of crisis. I followed the tracks of deer through the entire path. I am not a Christian, but the words inscribed on the trail helped to stop me from spiraling and making choices that would've hurt myself and those I love. I found peace here when I thought I could not. Thank you, bless you. We are One in Nature."

There are some people in our community we will never see walk through our doors at church. They may have different beliefs than us, and will never decide to seek faith. Our Labyrinth trail however, is such a unique space that is outside the walls of our church, where God can reach people in our community. We may never meet them, but the power of the Holy Spirit impacts those who need it.

There was no name attached. But this person felt compelled to share in our registry, and it is proof of God's power and purpose for us when we try new things to make a difference in our community. You never really know what a person might be going through, and it is our duty to love, be present, have grace, and to be the hands and feet of Christ to anyone we come in contact with.

I can't thank Tim Engelbrecht and our Boy Scouts enough for taking an idea and bringing it into fruition. Their hard work has provided us this new way of being a difference maker for the kingdom of Heaven. If you get a moment this summer, please come and experience the Labyrinth Trail. Sign the registry.
