

Wooten's Wonderings 🛬

On June 14, nine of us from Chili Pres went down to Irving New York, in the Cattaraugus Territory to spruce up the Wright Memorial Presbyterian Church. This church has a unique over 200 year history as an Indigenous Church and it is a member of the Western New York Presbytery and our Synod. The Mission Day was organized by the Synod of the Northeast as a way for us to build bridges and relationships with at least one of the four Indigenous Presbyterian Churches within the Synod's boarders. In addition to planning time to do building repairs, cleanup and landscaping, the day included an opportunity to learn more about the Seneca Nation's culture and history through a presentation by Flip White, member of the Seneca Tribal Council.

The part of his presentation which stood out to me the most was the explanation of the three guiding principles used by the Seneca in decision-making: the people, the environment, and the future. He then shared how these principles were applied in real-life scenarios with the tribe and with their struggles with the local and national government.

As I listened, it struck me that these principles are helpful to us as we talk about change. As our church boards and committees consider new decisions, or as we as individuals make a variety of choices and form opinions on any number of issues, these principles dovetail well with the way Jesus calls us to live in this world.

Jesus calls us to put people first. Over and over again, Jesus healed on the sabbath, going against human created religious laws in order to care for people in need. When making a decision, do we first consider how that decision will impact others? Do we consider how that idea positively or negatively affects people, even people we don't personally know?

We all live in God's world. This creation was given to us as a gift. Yet, our society tends to take it for granted. We make decisions that are primarily about our convenience but which have a lasting impact on the natural world. Climate change is warming our planet at an alarming rate and creating ripple effects for animals, forests, oceans and us. How does our role as caretakers of God's natural world impact decisions about what we buy, how much we throw away, and what polies we support?

The third principle about the future is often explained in this way: how will what we decide today impact people 7 generations down the line? Jesus consistently calls us to love our neighbors as ourselves. While we tend to think of loving our neighbors more in terms of the people her right now like in the first principle, we should also hold ourselves accountable for the well-being of future generations. While we do not fully know what the future will look like that far ahead, keeping in mind sustainability and leaving a positive legacy for those who come after us are ways that we live into our call as disciples in decision making.

This was not the first time I have visited the Seneca Nation territories (Alleghany and Cattaraugus). Each time I go, I learn a little more about who they are, the struggles they have been through as a people, their resilience and commitment to the values of people (relationship), environment and the future. The deep wisdom of indigenous peoples can teach us valuable lessons for our growth as followers of Jesus.

- ...Volunteered to be Liturgists on those Sundays.
- ...Pastor Brandi noted that she has a person to redesign our website with the \$1,000 grant the church received.

- ...Pastor Brandi noted that the Presbytery Neighborhood groups are being dissolved and the Committee on Ministry is being restructured.

- ...Voted to approve the hiring of Ishai Nardia as the Facebook Livestream Technician at \$20 per hour up to three hours per week.
- ...Voted to call a special meeting of the congregation for June 22nd after worship to discuss Pastor Brandi's terms of call based on changes from the Board of Pensions.
- ...Conducted personnel reviews for Pastor Brandi, Adam and Sandy.
- ...Voted that effective June 2nd, 2025, all background checks conducted will be done through Genesee Valley Presbytery using their company and form.
- ...Voted to pay off the balance of \$36.00 of the Westside News advertising invoice from the Session Discretionary budget line.
- ...Voted to reimburse Elder Wasmer an additional \$150 for lunch for the second leadership training session held on June 1st.
- ...Adjourned at 9:30 PM, with a shared benediction based upon the Great Commission.


