

Wooten's Wonderings 🛬

The roughly six months between the Day of Pentecost and the beginning of Advent is traditionally known as Ordinary time. This is a time when we, as followers of Jesus, are especially called to a clearer understanding of what it means to be a disciple.

As we journey into September, our hearts are drawn to this month's theme: "Encountering the Deep." This theme invites us to move beyond the surface of our faith and to courageously follow God's call into deeper waters—places of trust, surrender, and profound relationship.

In Luke 5:4-7, after a long night of fruitless labor, Simon Peter and his fellow fishermen were weary and ready to give up. Yet Jesus, stepping into their everyday routine, asked them to do something unexpected: "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." Though logic and experience told them otherwise, Simon responds, "Because you say so, I will let down the nets." The result was an overwhelming catch—so abundant that their nets began to break.


This passage beautifully illustrates God's invitation to each of us. Often, we find ourselves content to remain in the shallow end—where it feels safe, familiar, and manageable. Yet Jesus calls us into the deep, where faith is required and the outcome is out of our hands. The deep may seem daunting, marked by uncertainty and risk. But it is precisely there—beyond our comfort zones—that we encounter God in new, life-changing ways.

To "encounter the deep" means to listen for God's voice, even when it challenges our assumptions or disrupts our routines. It means saying, like Simon, "Because you say so, Lord," and daring to trust God's promises over our own understanding. In the deep waters of faith, we discover abundance—of grace, purpose, and connection—that we could never have imagined from the shore.

This month, may we each accept God's invitation to wade deeper, to trust a little further, and to experience the fullness of what God has prepared. Let us not be content with surface-level faith, but instead, let us venture out—knowing that Jesus meets us there and fills our nets beyond measure.

May your September be marked by courage, trust, and awe as you encounter the deep with God.

"Easy... 'cause Jesus sits on God's right hand!" Johnny replied.




Financial data entry position open.

Summary of the August 4, 2025 Session Meeting

At its last regularly scheduled meeting, Session...

- ...Opened with prayer led by Pastor Brandi.
- ...Voted to approve the Agenda with the addition of the Presbytery Meeting Report.
- ...Voted to approve the Consent Agenda.
- ...Voted to receive the Treasurer's Report.
- ...Pastor Brandi reported 32 pastoral care contacts.
- ...Discussed that following the Leadership Groups two-part retreat and discernment process, there is agreement to keep our current mission statement.
- ...Voted to approve \$350 in spending for professional expenses for Pastor Brandi to attend a nine week course on Digital Ministry.
- ...Confirmed that the joint meeting of the Session and Deacons is Monday, October 6th.
- ...Elder Engelbrecht reviewed the annual action items that are completed for August and upcoming in September.
- ...Recognized Kathy and Wayne Hornsberger for all they've done to beautify the church, especially cleaning and painting the entire basement. The Session also recognizes the Personnel Committee for their time and work completing staff reviews.
- ...Voted to receive the 2025 Staff Reviews Report from the Personnel Committee.
- ...Voted to approve the payment of 33% of Adam's salary for his paternity leave to be used from January-March, 2026. The rest is covered by insurance.
- ...Met with the Chair of Trustees, Andy Atwater, for the quarterly financial review.
- ...Discussed options for replacing Darla Diehl as the Finance Data Inputter, who is stepping down as of December 31st.
- ...Heard a report from Pastor Brandi and Elder Wasmer about the July Presbytery meeting.
- ...Adjourned at 8:53 PM, with a shared benediction based upon the Great Commission.
