Wooten's Wonderings



The first few lines of Madeline L'Engle's well-known poem "First Coming" says:

He did not wait till the world was ready, till men and nations were at peace.

He came when the Heavens were unsteady, and prisoners cried out for release.

He did not wait for the perfect time. He came when the need was deep and great.

It does not take a stretch of the imagination to see that the need globally and nationally is deep and great: climate change, dehumanization, ongoing conflicts, and deep social divisions are just a few of the many things which weigh on our hearts and minds.

While it is important all year round, Advent is especially a season when we imagine a world shaped by greater justice, love, and peace. The scripture readings during this season focus on God's hopes for what our world could become, and we are invited to be caught up in that dream, that vision.

Often, we think of dreams as a way to escape reality or as something unlikely to come true. Yet, dreaming is a sacred act—it opens us to new possibilities and lifts us out of despair and fear. It encourages us to turn our gaze upward, toward God, and to participate in shaping the world as God intends. Especially in times of uncertainty and division, dreaming reminds us that there is enough love, mercy, and courage for all.

As we journey into the expectation of Advent, the wonder of Christmas and the revelations of Epiphany, can we embrace the courage, the will, to dream and envision a better future and make steps toward making those dreams a reality? We need hope and imagination to navigate life's challenges and make the world a more just and compassionate place. Without it, we fall into despair.

The last lines of L'Engle's poem says:

In the mystery of the Word made Flesh the Maker of the stars was born.

We cannot wait till the world is sane to raise our songs with joyful voice, for to share our grief, to touch our pain, He came with Love: Rejoice! Rejoice!

Let us not wait. Let us have the will to dream of a more compassionate, more just world and raise our voices in praise to the God who comes once again to be born on the earth, sharing in our pain and showing us the way of Love.


Mission Outreach
